<p>COURSE DESCRIPTION:</p>	<p>This course is designed to be a continuation in the study of classic and contemporary practices in Theatre Arts. While much of the area of study is similar to Drama I, students will be expected to expand their skills and understanding of Theatre Arts and become more independent in creating roles as an actor and director. This is an academic course and will require study outside the classroom. An expanded and more in depth study of theatre history, stagecraft, acting practices, rehearsal techniques, and character development will be the focus of the semester. While there is no pre-requisite for this course, those who choose to take Drama II must be willing to apply themselves diligently to the coursework in order to keep pace with the class. Students of all skill levels are welcome and encouraged to attend and do their absolute best.</p>
<p>MAJOR COURSE GOALS:</p>	<p>Students will:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pursue a more in depth study of theatre history and understand the importance to modern theatre. Elizabethan theatre will be a greater focus in this class 2. Demonstrate understanding of emerging acting skills through performance and show a greater understanding of character development. 3. Identify key elements of stage environment and design and create a portfolio showing their understanding of producing a play. 4. Expanded and intensified techniques of body and vocal usage 5. Showing an understanding nuances of character from text and performance through performance assessments 6. Improvise and perform on stage in front of an audience
<p>COURSE ASSESSMENT PLAN:</p>	<p>Students will be assessed by the following: Emphasis is placed on the final product (summative assessment) of student learning. INSTRUCTIONAL PHILOSOPHY:	<p>All students will be required to perform during the course of the semester which may be stressful at times. Because of this, RESPECT of all individuals is mandatory at all times as each person will be expected to work outside their comfort zone from time to time. Acting will require students to take direction in order to allow the student actor to understand the role better. Students need to understand that all direction is done in order to enhance their learning experience in theatre performance.</p>
MAJOR COURSE PROJECTS AND INSTRUCTIONAL ACTIVITIES:	<p>Students will be expected to participate in the main stage production as an actor or crew member. In additions students will be expected to perform in class, create a production portfolio, and a variety of other activities related to Theatre and Theatre Production.</p>
CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS:	<p>Students are expected to be on time for class and prepared to participate in each days lesson. Be respectful of others, yourself, school property, and rules Be honest with your teacher and do not violate the academic code of conduct. Plagiarism and dishonesty on work is unacceptable</p>
